


What's your favorite summer activity?

Dragon Ball FighterZ

Release Date: Jan 26

The first proper fighting game in the Dragon Ball Z series, *Dragon Ball FighterZ* brings 3 vs 3 matches similar to *Marvel vs Capcom* with the ability to swap out characters during a fight.

Monster Hunter World

Release Date: Jan 26

I have some serious concerns about this game, but I do love the concept. It's like *Skyrim* or *The Witcher 3* but set in a realistic

Around the World: This game works with as few as two players and one ball, but more can play just as well. The goal is to make ever more difficult consecutive shots from various spots around the court, each one farther away from the basket than the last. Begin with a layup, then move on to shots from the following positions: halfway between the basket and free-throw line, at the free throw line, 20-feet from the basket along either side, at the 3-point line, and, last but certainly not least when it comes to difficulty, center court. The first player to make all these shots then one final lay-up wins.

Swimming

Beach Ball Race: You'll need two beach balls for this race. This is a basic race between as many kids as you have room for in the pool, from one end to the next. However, the kid needs to move the beach ball with them 'til they get to the finish line. And the twist is that they cannot use their hands! Only their nose and face.

Mermaid Race: This is for kids who are as comfortable as dolphins in the water. Basically, this is a race to see who can swim completely underwater for the longest and farthest. Although simple, it is a classic kids' swimming game. How long can you hold your breath?!

Soccer

Escape: One of 100 fun games to be found at [Coaching American Soccer](#), **Escape** is great for practicing dribbling skills *and* racking up UNICEF Kid Power points. It works like this: All players get a ball except two "sheriffs." Those with balls (the "outlaws") line up at one end of the field then make a fast break for the opposite end, dribbling all the while. The sheriffs then try to catch and tag out all the outlaws before they can escape to the other end of the field.

Red light Green light: This easy to learn classic game also serves as a useful soccer drill that helps kids learn to dribble and maintain control of the

ball in place at their feet! Kids love to play this soccer game because it's exciting and really keeps them on their toes, making them much better soccer players in the process! This game can be tailored to different skill levels by introducing other commands — "blue lights" or "orange lights" — that challenge kids to execute other soccer moves.

Baseball

500: Here is a game I love to play. I know it is still popular because my kids have played 500 and I wasn't the one who taught them. It is a great drill for baseball practice if only about half your team shows up. If you have 12 or 14 players at practice, it could be too many to play this game. You be the judge.

This game is really batting and fielding practice, only as a game. You, the coach, pitch batting practice to one player, and the rest of the team covers the field.

The fielders receive points for batted balls caught in the air and off the ground. They get 100 points for a caught ball before it hits the ground, 50 points for catching a one hopper, and 25 points for a ground ball.

We always played the game where you were deducted the same number of points if you dropped a fly ball, one hopper or ground ball. And when one person gets to 500 points, they get to come in and hit. You can always change the number of points to bat if things are moving slow.

Medieval open-world. I love the idea of an expansive Medieval RPG but recent footage of wooden dialogue and less-than-stellar facial animations has me concerned that this is releasing too soon. Don't be surprised if it's delayed.

Sea Of Thieves

Release Date: March 20

Sea of Thieves looks like a cool concept that's maybe a few years too late. I want to believe that it will be a big hit for the Xbox One, but cartoony pirate co-op strikes me as something with fairly limited reach. I hope I'm wrong and the game is a smash hit that defies all expectations. At the same time, I think I'd be more excited for a big pirate game that was more solo-focused with co-op as an option.
