




Have you served for the US?

Memorial Day

Memorial Day is when we remember the soldiers who fought in the military. Memorial Day became a national holiday in 1971, but before that on May 5, 1868 General John A. Logan who was the president of an organization for veterans wanted a national day of remembrance to recognize all of the soldiers who fought for America. Decoration Day was celebrated on May 30, when people would put flowers on graves of soldiers. Every state in the northern states made Decoration Day a official state holiday in 1890, but the southern states continued to honor their dead on different dates until the end of World War 1. Later Decoration day slowly became Memorial Day. In Decoration Day, people honored the soldiers who fought in the Civil War. Soon later in 1914 another war started, World War 1. After that they made it to where they celebrated everyone who had been in the military. Then later in 1963 Congress passed the Uniform Monday holiday act which moved the date to the last monday of May, so federal employee could have a three day weekend. Yaaaay! That same law also made Memorial Day a national holiday. Do you celebrate Memorial Day?

I love to read books. In the summer, I love to go to the Lake of the Ozarks.


What is your favorite subject to teach?
